# BRVA

## Fire Station 32 Replacement - \$7.5M

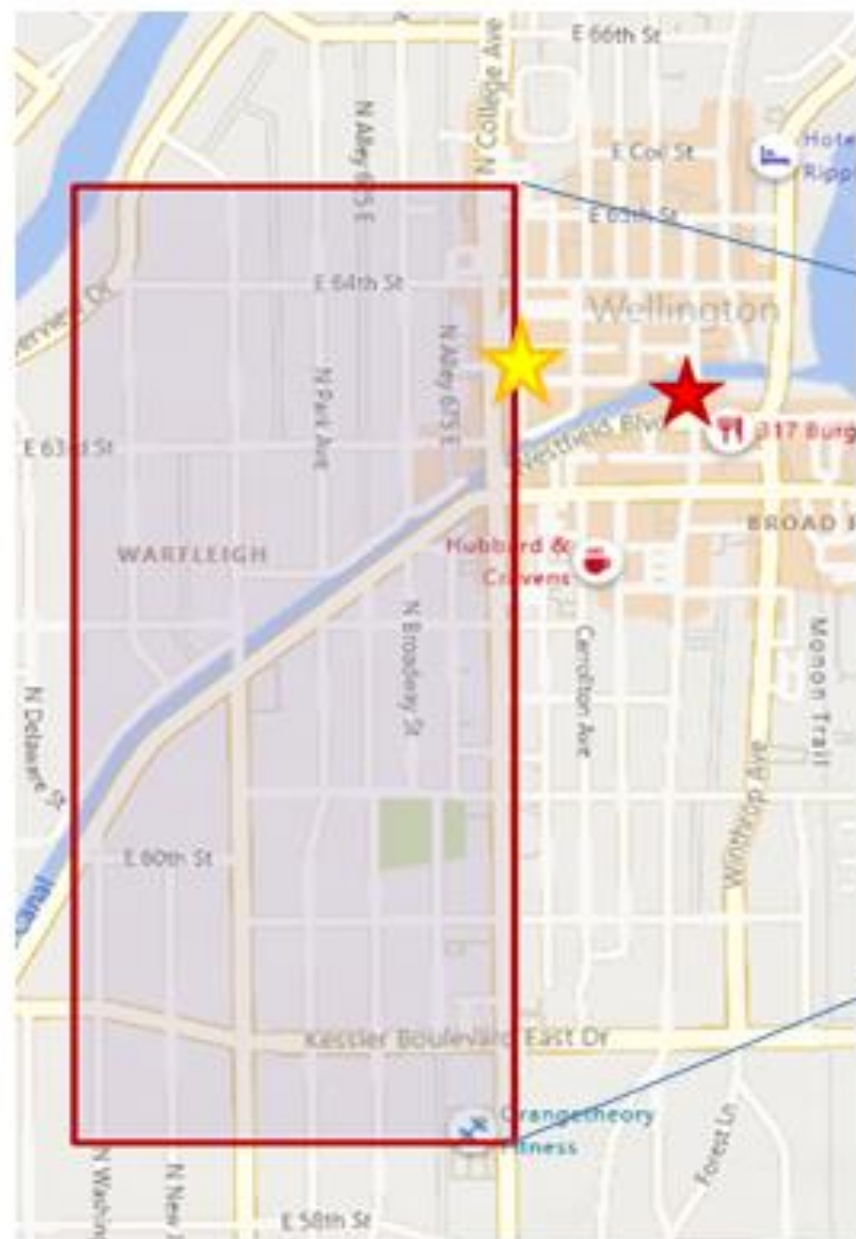
- Indianapolis Fire Department Station 32 is a historic fire station located at 6330 Guilford Avenue that serves a community of close to 17,000 residents. It was built in 1922 and listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 2011. DMD will work with the community and IHPC to for redevelopment opportunities.
- The two-level structure has experienced significant concrete deterioration in the engine bay area, with a recent concrete spall as the result of corrosion and water ponding within the facility. External recommendations suggest that the current conditions of the facility will worsen into significant structural concerns.
- IFD intends to model the new facility with the same interior concept as Station 3 in Fountain Square and Station 16 on Southport Rd. The exterior will aesthetically reflect the immediate area in which the station is built.

## Top 5 reasons why we need a new Broad Ripple fire station



- Current station is nearly 100 years old and deteriorating severely placing it next in the department's 20 Year Station Replacement Plan.
- Closure of Station 16 in 2016 has placed additional demands on the current response area.
- Various national standards ranging from community response capabilities to employee health and safety are currently being impacted.
- Modern fire apparatus does not fit into the bay without costly modifications.
- The current station is listed on the National Register of Historic Places (2011).

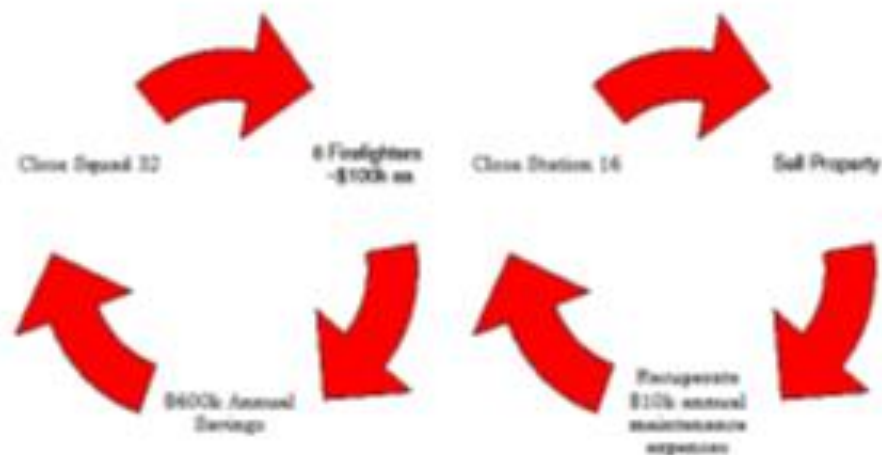

# Broad Ripple Firehouse

---

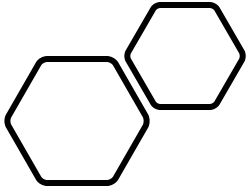
- Built in 1922, the BRVA took steps to declare the Broad Ripple Firehouse an historic landmark in 2011
- The BRVA will advocate that the building remain intact and that an appropriate use is found for its future
- Zoning changes will be required for a new use of the Firehouse, and those changes will go through the BRVA Land Use and Development Committee before being approved by the City





# Public Safety Improvements

- A few public safety incidents occurred earlier this year and our job is to advocate to the City for Public Safety improvements.
- The BRVA now meets weekly with the North Commander of IMPD and other officers, our City Councilor, and our Neighborhood Advocate from the Mayor's Office.
  - We review the previous week, discuss any incidents and performance and brainstorm ways to improve.
  - We have been successful at adding patrols during problematic times, adding security to parking lots, removing food trucks that were causing issues, etc.



## Public Safety Improvements

- The BRVA has facilitated meetings with business owners with security companies to install cameras in Broad Ripple
- Partnered with IMPD on the B-link program
  - Cameras may be accessed by IMPD
  - Signage indicates IMPD Monitoring

# Public Safety Improvements

- The City Council approved a new budget October 18 which includes Mayor Hogsett's plan for American Rescue Plan funds; highlighted by a \$150 million boost to violence reduction programming over three years, including:
  - 100 new IMPD officers and \$9 million in law enforcement technology
  - Funding for 50 Peacemakers and a drastic increase in annual grants to grassroots organizations focused on anti-crime initiatives
  - \$30 million for mental health programming





# Broad Ripple Avenue Redesign

---

- Final design has been completed
  - Added raised pedestrian walkway at Carrollton
  - More trees and landscaping were added
  - Plan includes wider sidewalks
  - 21 decorative streetlights along the Avenue
  - Festival string-lights will zig-zag down the street
  - New trashcans with recycling containers
- City has released the job out for bidding
- Construction to start Spring 2022, last 4 months
